That was my first expression when coming across one of Mr. Ken Kenia's chandeliers made of antlers.

Moose, elk and deer are the only animals that naturally shed their antlers each year. Using the resources provided by mother nature, Mr. Kenia creates one of a kind lamps, chandeliers, and other accessories for the home. Mr. Kenia works out of his studio located in Waitsfield, Vermont. His artwork is sold at Bridge Street Emporium gallery as well as other galleries in Vermont and New York.

Wires are perfectly concealed within the antlers. During the design process, antlers are carefully chosen for the final piece to ensure symmetry. Mr. Kenia often travels to the customers' homes for a site survey in order to recommend the best chandelier that fits into their living room space.

Mr. Kenia's is successful in maintaining the natural beauty of the antlers while ensuring that they are perfectly balanced from any angle. His attention to detail can be seen in his artwork.

It is common for antler collectors to use trained dogs to find naturally shed antlers. Mr. Kenia ensures that the purchased antlers are collected legally.
